Following are the trophies and Certificates that are awarded throughout the year and presented at our annual award presentation ceremony in November, called the 'At-Home'.

Summary Of Annual Awards

Best Landscape Print – Olaf Peterson Trophy - Awarded in March. Originally presented in 1990 by Dave Riddleston in honour of Olaf Peterson (the clubs Patron for many years)

Best Landscape Projected Image – The Ian Powell Trophy - Awarded in March.

Best Photojournalism Print – The John Miller Trophy - Awarded in May - Originally presented by John Miller in 1989.

Best Photojournalism Projected Image - The Russell Johnson Trophy - Awarded in May.

Best Portrait Print - The Vic Hawke Trophy - Awarded in July.

Best Portrait Projected Image - Ian James Trophy - Awarded in July - Originally presented by Ian James in 2001

Best Photo Essay Print (set) - Awarded in September - Originally presented by Russell Jackson

Best Photo Essay Projected Image (set) HPS Trophy - Awarded in September.

Best Natural History Print - The Hosking Trophy - Awarded in October - Originally presented by Rex & Maria Hosking in 1989.

Best Natural History Projected Image – The Geoff Moon Trophy - Awarded in October - Originally presented by Geoff Moon (Club Patron) in 1995.

Best Audio Visual - Best A.V Cup - Awarded in October - Originally presented by Russell Jackson.

Champion Portfolio Print Set – The NG Ritchie Cup - Awarded in November - Originally presented in 1964.

Champion Portfolio Projected Image Set – The Agfa Cup - Awarded in November - Originally presented in 1964.

Champion Portfolio Single Print – The Burgess Cup - Awarded in November - Originally presented in 1991 by Bruce Burgess.

Champion Portfolio Single Projected Image - The Yvonne Kalman Trophy - Awarded in November - Originally presented by Yvonne Kalman in 1991.

Champion B Grade Single Print – The Sadgrove Trophy - Awarded in November - Originally presented in 1974 in honour of the late Did Sadgrove by her husband Wal.

Trophies & Certificates of Achievement

Highest total points for prints for the year. Henderson Photographic Society, first presented in 1963.

Highest total points - projected images. Henderson Photographic Society, presented in 1963.

The Presidents Plate - Highest total points in prints and projected images combined for the year. First presented by Dalton Dean (Clubs first President) in 1963.

Most improved photographer throughout the year (Selected by the committee)
Certificates for 5 or more Honours throughout the year, one for prints & another for projected images.

Special Awards (certificates of appreciation)

Going the extra mile, awarded to the most deserving member for what they have done for the club through the year. (A wooden walking stick/mono pod made by Bert Woolcott each year)
The committee may award **Special Certificates** to those who have shown an outstanding achievement either to photography or the Society in general.

Trophy Holders Responsibilities

Members who receive an annual trophy award in November (the time they receive it) must return it by the Audio Visual night in October the following year. It will then be the member's responsibility to return the award to the trophy steward at his or her own cost so it can be cleaned and engraved for the next recipient. Should a member move out of Auckland the trophy must be returned prior to the member leaving.

Cleaning should only consist of a wipe over with a damp cloth; no cleaning solutions, pastes or abrasives are to be used. (Cups will be professional cleaned once a year). Should a trophy be damaged or lost, the recipient must advise the trophy steward as soon as it is possible.
